# Water Rescue Capability- All Appliances

There are 15 Fire Station across the service area, all personnel are trained to basic level of water rescue response,

- Bankside Rescue
- Wading Rescue

#### All Appliances

- Life Jackets /Flood Suits
- Throw Lines
- Reach Pole
- Floating Hose







# Water Rescue Units- Specialist Teams

There are two Water Rescue Units within the Service area, located Bishop Auckland & Durham Fire Stations.

Specialist Training and Equipment.

- In & On Water Response (Wade, Swim or Paddle Rescue)
- Powered Boat for Rescue Response
- Search Equipment
- Animal Rescue Training













# **High Volume Pumps**

**HVP** Consists of a sled carrying a Hydrosub, which is a hydraulically driven pump capable of delivering 7000 L/min, and a second sled containing 1km of hose











### Winter & Flood Advice



#### Before a flood warning

- Be Aware of the Flood Warnings
- Familiarise yourself with the government's alert systems
- Make an evacuation plan
- Prepare an emergency kit.
- Let your neighbours know
- Move sentimental and important items/documents upstairs.
- Move vehicles to higher ground .





### Winter & Flood Advice



#### What to do during a flood

- If the flood is posing a threat to your safety, call the emergency services immediately.
- Don't walk, swim or drive through floodwater.
- Don't walk on sea defences or riverbanks.
- Avoid contact with floodwater.
- Don't allow children / pets to play in or near floodwater.
- If you need to evacuate, turn off the mains power before you leave.
- Take all pets with you when you leave so they aren't trapped by rising water.
